

## SCOPE

This document specifies requirements for an occupational health and safety (OHS) management system, and gives guidance for its use, to enable us to provide safe and healthy work-places by preventing work-related injury and ill health, as well as by proactively improving its Occupation Health & Safety (OHS) performance, considering external and internal issues.

This document is applicable to our organization and wishes to establish, implement and maintain an OHS management system to improve occupational health and safety, eliminate hazards and minimize OHS risks (including system deficiencies), take advantage of OHS opportunities, and address OHS management system nonconformities associated with its activities.

The manual helps us to achieve the intended outcomes of its OHS management system. Consistent with the organization's OHS policy, the intended outcomes of an OHS management system include:

- a) continual improvement of OHS performance.
- b) fulfilment of legal requirements and other requirements.
- c) achievement of OHS objectives.
- d) take into account the planned or performed work-related activities.

The scope and manual is applicable to the OHS risks under the organization's control, taking into account factors such as the context in which the organization operates and the needs and expectations of its workers and other interested parties.

This document enables an organization, through its OHS management system, to integrate other aspects of health and safety, such as worker wellness/wellbeing.

This document does not address issues such as product safety, property damage or environmental impacts, beyond the risks to workers and other relevant interested parties.

  
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
