
Instructions for use

High Output





About this product

The enclosed Pelican 1-piece pouches are used to collect output from a stoma. The baseplate attached to the pouch is intended to adhere to intact peristomal skin. Individual wear times may vary.

A convex option may be suitable for retracted, flush or other challenging stomas only after assessment from a stoma care professional.

Our Pelican High Output pouches are compatible with Faecal Collector pouches.



How to apply your pouch






1. Choosing the correct size pouch

If your stoma is round then your Pelican pouch may be available in pre-cut sizes which will give you a snug fit. Use the enclosed measuring guide and choose a hole size which is the same, or slightly larger than your stoma.


2. Cutting the baseplate (on cut-to-fit pouches only)

If your stoma is not round or you wish to cut a particular circle, trace the shape onto the release film and cut with a curved scissors.

How to remove your pouch




3. Applying the adhesive baseplate First prepare skin by ensuring the area around your stoma is clean and dry. Remove the release film. Fold back the top of the pouch and locate by placing the lower part of the baseplate below the stoma. Now press the baseplate against your skin and smooth it with your fingers. This also helps to warm the baseplate which improves adhesion.



Peel the baseplate away from your skin.

How to drain your pouch



1. Gently squeeze the outlet to stem the flow of output and then release the bung stopper. **2.** Fold back the stopper and connect to the bung rest. The bung rest is designed to hold the stopper clear of the outlet to aid pouch draining.


3. Release the outlet to allow the output to pass from the pouch. Once empty, wipe the outlet clean and replace the bung stopper until secure.

4. Optional

To connect a faecal collection bag, squeeze the outlet again and simply connect the tube directly over the bung. Do not replace the bung stopper.

How to use the filter covers







These can be used on our high output pouches and are normally used when bathing or to prevent 'pancaking' (when the firmer stool stays around the stoma and does not drop into the pouch). A filter cover can be applied by lifting up the split fabric and placing the cover over the filter which can be seen as a dark circle. Place used products into waste bag and waste bin.

Do not flush product down the toilet. Dispose of waste products in accordance with local guidelines.

Warnings and cautions

Consult a healthcare professional if any skin irritation, redness or discomfort around the stoma is experienced. Re-use of a single use product may have potential to harm the user due to the risk of contamination and impairment in product function.

Skin adhesion and wear time may be reduced in conditions of elevated temperature or humidity, or if the baseplate is re-positioned after first application.

Other information

Store flat in the carton between 10° and 30° Celsius. Do not refrigerate. Keep dry. Do not use if packaging damaged.
